Media Advisory: University of Oregon Police Find Stolen Bikes

- What:** Many University of Oregon students bikes have been stolen since January and into early March when campus was shut down. The UO Police Department will be holding a news conference explaining the details of this story.
- When:** 10 a.m. Thursday, April 24
- Where:** The corner of 13th Ave. and University St., outside the Erb Memorial Union
- Who:** UO Police Department Chief Roger Goodell and Eugene Police Chief Pete Carroll
- Why:** UO and Eugene police raided the home of a 6 foot tall, blond hair Caucasian male yesterday after obtaining a search warrant. They recovered all 50 bikes that were stolen from the UO campus, as well as another 100 bikes that are believed to have been stolen from the West University area. In addition to the suspect described above, police arrested four young men at the residence (ages 18-21).
At Thursday's news conference, police will name the suspects who have been arrested, describe how they broke up the ring, and provide details of how students can recover their stolen bikes.
